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### UPPER-DIVISION GENERAL EDUCATION

Students must complete GE Area A1, A2, A3 and B4 courses prior to enrolling in an Upper-division GE course. Upper-division GE courses should be taken *after* you have completed 60 units. Select one course from each row.

### DIVERSITY AND EQUITY REQUIREMENT

Students must satisfy two Diversity and Equity (DE) requirements by taking one course certified for Diversity and Equity in the United States (DEu) and one course certified for Diversity and Equity in Global Contexts (DEg). DE certified courses can also count with other GE, major, minor and/or elective courses. **To avoid taking additional units, it is recommended that students meet the DE courses within Upper-division GE.**
