# CHILD AND ADOLESCENT DEVELOPMENT

- Students are required to verify a clear background check including statewide, county, and federal screening (social security number, fingerprinting), complete a tuberculosis test, and provide evidence of a history of full immunization against Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR), Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis/whooping cough) and provide proof of flu immunization (or an exemption) no earlier than one year and no later than three weeks prior to the semester in which they enroll in CHAD 496.
- Background check or additional screening may also be required for students seeking to work with minors in other courses (ex: CHAD 450, PSYC 495, PSYC 499, or EDUC 380/HD380).
- This worksheet is intended for supplemental use only. The University will use your Academic Requirements Report (ARR) to track your graduation requirements, including those for your major. Please continue to check your ARR for accuracy.
