Note 1 - Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, continued

Property and Equipment
The Organization capitalizes all expenditures for property and equipment in excess of \$5,000. Equipment and
improvements are recorded at cost or at estimated fair value at date of gift if donated, Expenditures for
maintenance and repetre are charged against operations. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis over
the estimated useful fives of the assets of 5 years.

Restricted Cean
The Organization holds funds for on-campus student organizations to fund activities. These funds can be drawn
upon at any time by the on-campus student organizations and are recognized as a liability to the University under

Revenue:

Each enrolled student of the University was required to pay \$76 and \$50 per semester for an associated student body fee for the years ended June 30, 2018 and 2017, respectively. These payments support the Organization's operations and are collected by the University Business Office and remitted to the Organization, at which time they are reconsided as revenue or deferred revenue, Deferred revenue represents the portion of student body fees coffected for the summer and fetil sessions applicable to the next fiscal year.

<u>Fair Value Measurements</u>

The certying value of cash, receivables, and payables approximates fair value as of June 30, 2018 and 2017, due to the relative eight maturities of these instruments.

Reclassifications
Cortain reclassifications have been made to the 2017 financial statement presentation to correspond to the current year's format. Retained earnings and changes in retained earnings are unchanged due to these reclassifications. For the year ended June 30, 2017, \$159,777 in hunds held for others was reclassified to due to related purities on the balance sheet. The reclassification is related to student organization which are reported under the University. In edition, for the year ended June 30, 2017, \$230,710 was reclassified from eccounts payable to due to related party.

Subsequent Events
The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through September 26, 2018, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Management is not aware of any events that have occurred subsequent to the statement of financial position date that would require adjustments to, or disclosuree in the financial

### Note 2 - Concentrations of Credit Risk

The Organization maintains an account at a finencial institution with funds insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDiC). The Organization's account at this institution may, at times, exceed FDiC-insured limits of up to \$250,000. The Organization has not experienced any such losses in these accounts.

Note 1 - Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Activities
The Associated Students, Inc. of California State University San Marcos (Organization) is a non-profit California
corporation organized in 1994 as an audilary organization to California State University San Marcos (University)
operated in accordance with the General Nonprofit Corporation Law of the State of California. The Organization
administrars ventious autident programs and estivities. Student fees and other revenues are collected for the
support of student-related programs and for the ecquisition of assets that benefit the student body.

The Organization's financial statements are included as a component unit of the University's annual general purpose financial statements. This is required by government accounting standards that apply to the University.

Related Perios

The Organization is related to other auxiliaries of the University, Including California State University San Mercos
Corporation (SM Corp), formerly known as University Auxiliary and Research Services Corporation (UARSC),
San Marcos University Corporation (UCorp), which marged with Campus and SM Corp, and California State
University San Marcos Foundation (Foundation). These auxiliaries and the University periodically provide versious services to one another.

Besis of Presentation
The Organization reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to the three classes
of net sesset; unnestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

- Unrestricted net assets represent expendable funds evallable for operations, which are not otherwise limited by donor restrictions.
- Temporarily restricted net assets consist of contributed funds subject to donor-imposed restrictions contingent upon specific performance of a future event or a specific passage of time before the Organization may spend the funds.
- Permanently restricted net assets are subject to irrevocable donor restrictions requiring that the essets be maintained in perpetuity usually for the purpose of generating investment income to fund current operations.

As of June 30, 2018 and 2017, all of the Organization's net assets were classified as unrestricted net assets represent funds that are fully available, at the discretion of management and the Associated Students Council, for the Organization to utilize in any of its programs or services.

<u>Use of Estimates</u>

The preparation of finencial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting princip menagement to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Taxes
The Organization is a qualified non-profit organization that is exempt from Income saves under Section 501(c)(3)
of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 23701(d) of the Californis Revenue and Texation Code. However, the
Organization remains aubject to taxes on any not Income which is derived from a trade or business regularly
carried on and unrelated to its exempt purpose.

The Organization follows accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America related recognition of uncertain tax positions. The Organization recognizes accrued interest and penaltities associate uncertain tax positions as part of the statements of exititives, when explicately. Managament has determine the Organization has no uncertain tax positions as of June 30, 2018 and 2017 and therefore no amounts been accrued.

The total cost basis of equipment under capital leases as of June 30, 2018 and 2017 was \$24,103. Accumulated depreciation associated with these assets as of June 30, 2018 and 2017 was \$9,829 and \$5,280, respectively.

The Organization entered into a sublease with UCorp as of January 2014 to lease spaces in the University Student Union, which expired June 30, 2017 and was subsequently renewed with the University. As consideration for the leased space, the Organization operates extend programs with the space leased in the University Student Union. This relationship is recognized as in-kind revenus and expense shown within other income and management and general expenses on the statements of ecolobiae. Total in-kind rent revenus and expense for the years entied June 30, 2016 and 2017 was \$85,422 and \$83,987, respectively.

The Organization receives services from and provides services to the University and related parties including Foundation and SM Corp. In July 2010, the Organization enlared into a payroll and employment services agreement with SM Corp under which all of the Organization's personnel became employees of SM Corp. The Organization paye SM Corp the coats and fees of providing payroll and benefits along with an administrative fee.
