Joint Audit Committee Charge

Background and Purpose

The Joint Audit Committee ("the JAC") oversees internal financial control practices, corporate compliance activities, and outside auditors for the Boards of Directors of the California State University San Marcos Corporation ("CSUSM Corporation"), the California State University San Marcos Foundation ("Foundation") and Associated Students Inc. of California State University San Marcos ("ASI") respectively. The JAC has been formed by formal action of each Board to gain time and effort efficiencies, reduce audit costs and take advantage of common audit attributes.

Delegation of Authority and Responsibility

The respective Boards authorize JAC to:

- Review and assess the adequacy of the JAC <u>Ce</u>harge <u>S</u>statement and recommend changes to the respective Boards for joint approval.
- Participate in the selection or discharge of the external auditor.
- Review policies and procedures as needed for the purpose of assuring the adequacy of internal controls and financial operating procedures.
- Review the annual audited financial statements with the independent audit firm, including any issues encountered in conducting the audit and make a recommendation to the respective Boards.
- Review the annual exempt organization returns (IRS Forms 990/990T), prepared by the independent audit firm in conjunction with the annual financial audit and make recommendations to the respective Boards.
- Review and discuss any management letter or any communication letters provided by the outside auditor and responses provided by management.
- Report to the respective auxiliary Boards and make recommendations to the Boards periodically on matters within the Charge Statement.
- Call closed meetings to discuss with independent audit firm representatives or any member of management of the participating organizations as may be required under circumstances within the Charge Statement.
- Report to any or all of the respective Boards as circumstances may require, such matters as conflict of interest, private inurement or other insider transactions, the use of the organization's funds for illegal

- payment, and any other questionable practices that may come to the attention of the JAC.
- Inform the respective Boards of developments in accounting principles that will affect the auxiliaries, as well as relevant rulings by the IRS and other regulatory bodies.

Audit Committee Membership

The JAC will be composed of at least six members: Two (2) Board members appointed from and by each respective Board. Board chairs and treasurers (including CFOs) may not serve on the JAC.

The JAC may include additional respective Board members or persons who are non-Board members, as the JAC may determine. Each Board shall appoint JAC members for terms specified by each participating organization.

The JAC Chair shall be a CSUSM Corporation Board member appointed by the CSUSM Corporation Board Chair. The JAC Chair may not serve simultaneously as a finance committee member of an appointing Board.

No JAC member shall be a member of a finance committee of respective Board. The JAC will not include members of a participating organization or University staff, although staff members are permitted to attend meetings.

Meetings

JAC meetings shall be conducted consistent with the open meeting law requirements of the respective Boards. The JAC may adopt implementing meeting procedures.

A quorum will consist of 50% of the total JAC membership.

The JAC will meet at least three times each fiscal year: prior to audit work beginning, to receive the annual financial audit reports and to review tax returns. Additional meetings will be held as required.

At the end of each-meetings pertaining to audit, time will be provided in which the Committee may converse separately with audit firm representatives without the presence of staff.



Income Taxes, continued
The Organization follows accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America related to the recognition of uncertain tax positions. The Organization recognizes accrued interest and penalties associated with uncertain tax positions as part of the statements of activities, when applicable. Management has determined that the Organization has no uncertain tax positions as of June 30, 2020 and 2019 and therefore no amounts have been prefruited.

Property and Equipment
The Organization capitalizes all expenditures for property and equipment in excess of \$5,000. Equipment and improvements are recorded at cost or at estimated fair value at date of gift if donated. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged against operations. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets of 5 years.

Restricted Cash
The Organization holds funds for on-campus student organizations to fund activities. These funds can be drawn
upon at any time by the on-campus student organizations and are recognized as a liability to the University under

Revenue Student fees - Each enrolled student of the University was required to pay \$75 per semester for an associated student body fee for the years ended June 30, 2020 and 2019. These payments support the Organization's operations and are collected by the University Business Office and remitted to the Organization, at which time they are recorded as revenue or deferred revenue. Deferred revenue represents the portion of student body fees collected for the summer and fall sessions applicable to the next fiscal year.

Grants and Contributions – Revenues from grants and contracts are recognized to the extent of eligible costs incurred up to an amount not to exceed the total grant or contract authorized. Deferred revenue results from grant awards and contracts received (or in accounts receivable) that are applicable to the subsequent period. Contributions received are recorded as net assets without donor restrictions or net assets with donor restrictions, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor-imposed restrictions. Donor restricted contributions are reported as an increase in net assets with donor restrictions, depending on the nature of restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), net assets with donor restrictions are reclassified to net assets without donor restrictions and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. Contributions received with donor-imposed restrictions that are satisfied within the same reporting period are reported as support without donor restrictions and increase net assets without donor restrictions. and increase net assets without donor restrictions

Fair Value Measurements
The carrying value of cash, receivables, and payables approximates fair value as of June 30, 2020 and 2019, due to the relative short maturities of these instruments

Note 1 - Organization and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Activities

The Associated Students, Inc. of California State University San Marcos (Organization) is a non-profit California corporation organized in 1994 as an auxiliary organization to California State University San Marcos (University) operated in accordance with the General Nonprofit Corporation Law of the State of California. The Organization administers various student programs and activities. Student fees and other revenues are collected for the support of student-related programs and for the acquisition of assets that benefit the student body.

The Organization's financial statements are included as a component unit of the University's annual general-purpose financial statements. This is required by government accounting standards that apply to the University.

New Accounting Pronouncement
In June 2018, the Financial Accounting Standard Board (FASB) issued ASU 2018-08, Clarifying the Scope and the Accounting Guidance for Contributions Received and Contributions Made (Topic 958). This standard update clarifies and improves the scope and the accounting guidance for contributions received and contributions made under accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP). Effective January 1.2019, the Organization adopted ASI 2018-08, Clarifying the Scope and the Accounting Guidance for Contributions Received and Contributions Made (Topic 958). Management has analyzed the provisions of ASU 2018-08 and concluded that no changes were necessary to conform with the new standard.

Related Parties
The Organization is related to other auxiliaries of the University, including California State University San Marcos
Corporation (SM Corp), and California State University San Marcos Foundation (Foundation). These auxiliaries and the University periodically provide various services to one another.

Basis of Presentation
The financial statements of the Organization have been prepared in accordance with US GAAP, which require the Organization to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to the following net asset

- Net assets without donor restrictions Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed restrictions and may be expended for any purpose in performing the primary objectives of the Organization. These net assets may be used at the discretion of the Organization's management and the board of directors.
- Net assets with donor restrictions Net assets subject to stipulations imposed by donors, and grantors. Some donor restrictions are temporary in nature; those restrictions will be met by actions of the Organization or by the passage of time. Other donor restrictions are perpetual in nature, where by the donor has stipulated the funds be maintained in perpetuity. The Organization did not have any donor restrictions that were temporary or perpetual in nature for the years ended June 30, 2020 and 2019.

Donor restricted contributions are reported as increases in net assets with donor restrictions. When a restriction expires, net assets are reclassified from net assets with donor restrictions to net assets without donor restrictions. expires, net assets are reclas in the statements of activities.

<u>Use of Estimates</u>

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

The Organization is a qualified non-profit organization that is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 23701(d) of the California Revenue Code and Section 23701(d) of the California Revenue and Taxation Code. However, the Organization remains subject to taxes on any net income which is derived from a trade or business regularly carried on and unrelated to its exempt purpose.

Future Accounting Standards
FASB has issued two substantial ASUs which will become effective in future years.

The amendments in ASU 2014-09 Revenue from Contracts with Customers and subsequent updates require that an entity should recognize revenue to depict the transfer of promised goods or services to customers in amount that reflects the consideration to which the entity expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services. Adoption of the new standard is to be applied on a full retrospective basis or modified retrospective basis. The Organization is in the process of assessing how this new ASU and subsequent updates will affect the Organization's reporting of revenues, effective July 1, 2020. This assessment includes determining the effect of the new standard on the Organization's financial statements, accounting systems, business processes, and internal controls. Based on its assessment to date, the Organization does not currently expect adoption to have a material effect on its revenues. Adoption of ASU 2014-09 will also require enhanced financial statement disclosures about the nature, amount, timing and uncertainty of revenue and cash flows arising from contracts with customers. The amendments in ASU 2014-09 Revenue from Contracts with Customers and subsequent updates require that

In February 2016, the FASB issued ASU No. 2016-02 Leases. The primary change in GAAP addressed by ASU 2016-02 is the requirement for a lessee to recognize on the balance sheet a liability to make lease payments ("lease liability") and a right-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying asset for the lease term. ASU (lease liability) and a ngnt-of-use asset representing its right to use the underlying asset for the lease term. ASU 2016-02 also requires qualitative and quantitative disclosures to enable users of the financial statements to assess the amount, timing, and uncertainty of cash flows arising from leases. ASU 2016-02 is effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2020. In May 2020, FASB voted to propose delaying the effective date until years beginning after December 15, 2021. Lessees must apply a modified retrospective transition approach for leases existing at, or entered into after, the beginning of the earliest comparative period presented in the financial statements. The Organization is evaluating the effect that the provisions of ASU 2016-02 will have on its financial statements and related disclosures.

<u>Subsequent Events</u>
The Organization has evaluated subsequent events through September 29, 2020, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

As of the date through which the Organization has evaluated events occurring subsequent to the statement of financial position date June 30, 2020, the Organization believes it understands the risk associated with Covid-19. The Organization is in the process of implementing risk mitigation tactics for the Organization as to the risk of the impact, if any, of Covid-19 related to all aspects of the Organization's business transactions with oustomers and vendors and human interaction within and outside of the Organization.

Note 2 - Concentrations of Credit Risk

The Organization maintains an account at a financial institution with funds insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The Organization's account at this institution may, at times, exceed FDIC-insured limits of up to \$250,000. The Organization has not experienced any such losses in these accounts.

Note 7 - Transactions with Related Parties

The Organization receives services from and provides services to the University and related parties including Foundation and SM Corp. In July 2010, the Organization entered into a payroll and employment services agreement with SM Corp under which all of the Organization's personnel became employees of SM Corp. The Organization pays SM Corp the costs and fees of providing payroll and benefits along with an administrative fee.

The original term of the agreement was one year, but it renews automatically unless either party gives three

The Organization holds assets for various student organizations as well. The activity for these student organizations is recorded with the University. Therefore, the organization records cash and a liability due to the University.

Excess money of the Organization is held by the University in a pooled investment account. The amount held on behalf of the Organization and its proportional share of investment income is included in due from related parties.

Note 5 - Operating Leases

The Organization entered into a sublease with SM Corp as of January 2014 to lease spaces in the University Student Union, which expired June 30, 2017 and was subsequently renewed with the University for 10 years. As consideration for the leased space, the Organization operates student programs with the space leased in the University Student Union. This relationship is recognized as in-kind revenue and expense shown within other income, program services and management and general expenses on the statements of activities. Total in-kind rent revenue and expense for the years ended June 30, 2020 and 2019 was \$89,210 and \$87,805, respectively.
