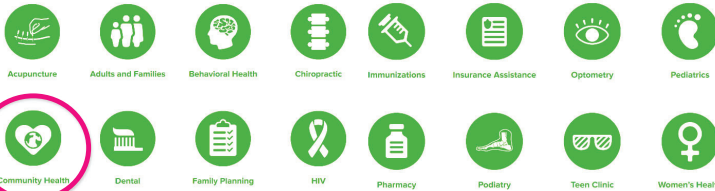

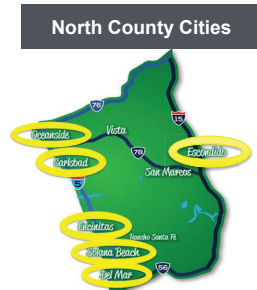

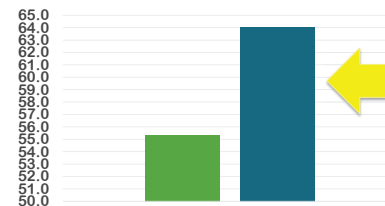
- **120 cities** in California have passed Smoke-Free Outdoor Dining

 - Carlsbad, Chula Vista, County of San Diego (2020), Coronado, Del Mar, El Cajon, Encinitas, Escondido (2020), Imperial Beach, La Mesa (2020), National City, Oceanside, and Solana Beach.

Percentage of Restaurants with Outdoor Dining

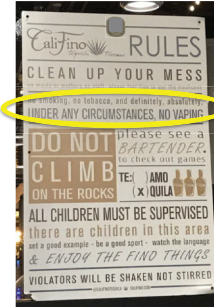

Vista Community Clinic's Tobacco Control Program collected public opinion polls among:

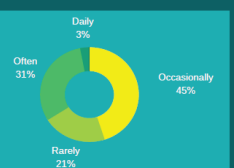
