



Smoke-Free Outdoor Dining Policies In CA

- 120 cities in California have passed Smoke-Free Outdoor Dining
- 13 cities in San Diego County have smokefree outdoor dining policies including:
 - Carlsbad, Chula Vista, County of San Diego (2020), Coronado, Del Mar, El Cajon, Encinitas, Escondido (2020), Imperial Beach, La Mesa (2020), National City, Oceanside, and Solana Beach.

"At first I was concerned that it would be bad for business or that it would be infringing on the rights of smokers, then I realized that there is no right to impose health risks on others and ultimately voted to protect the health of the city. We have had no complaints and only compliments since passing the ordinance; it has been a win-win situation."
