

## A Resolution in Support of Governor Brown's Tax Initiative Proposal

1 2 3	WHEREAS,	the Associated Students Inc. (ASI) of California State University San Marcos (CSUSM) is the official representative body, and the voice of CSUSM's more than 10,000 students and is entrusted to represent the best interest of our constituents; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS,	it is the mission of ASI to educate students on issues that impact them, and advocate for the student perspective to the appropriate parties, which include the university administration and faculty, and government representatives and agencies on the local, statewide and national levels; and
8 9	WHEREAS,	the CSU has recently faced substantial budget cuts from the state, including a reduction of \$750 million in 2011-2012 alone, and
10 11 12	WHEREAS,	in addition to the state budget cuts, the CSU has also faced a series of tuition and fee increases since 2001, raising the cost of undergraduate attendance from \$1,428 in 2001 to an estimated \$5,970 in 2011 and
13 14 15	WHEREAS,	every \$1 invested in the CSU yields a \$5.43 return back to the California economy, sustains almost 150,000 jobs and provides a majority of graduates in key economic areas such as agriculture, medicine, criminal justice and education
16	WHEREAS,	the state of California has a\$15.7 billion deficit and
17 18	WHEREAS,	the current state budget assumes the passage of Governor Brown's Tax Initiative in order to balance the budget, and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS,	the California higher education system faces and automatic "trigger cut" of \$250 million to the CSU and the University of California (UC) system, and \$548.5 million to the California Community College (CCC) system if voters do not approve the Governor's Tax Initiative in November 7, and
23 24 25 26	WHEREAS,	the California budget also includes an increase in funding of \$125 million to the CSU and UC in 2013-2014 if the Tax Initiative is approved and tuition and fees are maintained at 2011-2012 levels for the 2012-2013 school year but will likely face a cut of \$7 million because of decreased state support unrelated to proposition 30,
27	NOW, THEREFORE BE IT	
28 29	RESOLVED,	that the ASI of CSUSM supports the Governor's Tax Initiative and its dedication of funds to education and a balanced state budget, and be it further

30 31 RESOLVED, that ASI of CSUSM will take an active role in advocating for higher education, its benefits 32 to the state of California and the issues affecting each campus to state and local 33 representative and the general public, 34 RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be distributed widely, including, but not limited to, CSU 35 Board of Trustees, CSU Chancellor Charles B.
