Before the start of the Fall 2023 Semester, President Neufeldt signed Second Nature Presidents' Climate Leadership Commitment. This commits our campus to carbon neutrality and accelerates our efforts to work with our community on climate justice and resilience planning. This is a big win for our Sustainability Program and our campus, due in no small part to the initiative taken by current and past students and the continuous drive from our Sustainability Manager, Juliana Goodlaw-Morris. Our campus now joins over 650 other colleges and universities on the journey to becoming carbon-neutral and taking climate action toward a more sustainable future.

We want to thank everyone who helped make this day possible, including FDM and the VP FAS office. Many people were involved in the preparation- from procuring the tree to plant on the day of the signing, to painting the shovels gold. Thank you all and we are excited for the future of campus sustainability and climate action.

In addition to signing the climate commitment, CSUSM along with five of our sister campuses, won the 2023 American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU)Excellence & Innovation Award for Sustainability and Sustainable Development. The project was a collaborative effort among six CSU campuses, including Cal State San Marcos. The project was led by Chico State.



The Faculty Learning Community in Teaching Climate Change and Resilience initiative that received the award was selected "for its outstanding results and potential to influence and serve as a model for other institutions and systems."

Over the past several months our Zero Waste Donation Pick-Up form has gained a lot of traction and we have completed about 50 pick-up requests over the summer. Since we have been able to collect and divert so many office supplies from going to the landfill, we decided to invite campus members to visit our overflowing storage unit and take all the supplies they needed at our Crash's Free Store event. While it was the first time we hosted an event like this, it was well received and roughly 100 people passed through. By the end of our event, about three-fourths of our supplies redistributed to our campus community members.

We are thankful for all of **Eduardo's** hard work and pleased to spotlight him. Eduardo has played an important role in helping us work towards our goal of Zero Waste by 2025. He continuously shows up for our Sustainability team, going above and beyond to help. Eduardo helped with both move-out and move-in events, our first Crash's Free Store event, and much more. Events, Partnerships, and Lots of Success



During this year's move-in our team partnered with Housing to distribute dorm items to students which were collected during move-out. Over 800 pounds of kitchen and dorm supplies were given back to students moving into the QUAD and UVA. This included items such as Tupperware, utensils, plates, bowls, cups, and more!

For the first week of this semester, we partnered with the Cougar Care Network (CCN) to get school supplies to students. CCN had three Cougar Question Mart stations throughout campus and Marissa provided school supplies to each station for all 4 days of this event. The Sustainability Student Assistants put together school supplies goodie bags which consisted of pencils, pens, erasers, highlighters, and sticky notes which all went to students on the first day of school. We also distributed binders, folders, and desk-side organizers. Based on the feedback we received, students enjoyed the free supplies, and we hope to continue this effort next year.

How long have you been at CSUSM? Why did you choose this campus?


