Sustainability Success this Past Spring

During Earth Month this past spring we had multiple events that brought awareness to our current climate crisis. During our Climate & Justice Teach-In we had over 120 people in attendance. This partnered event brought students and faculty together in a unique virtual discussion about Climate Science, Climate Justice and Indigenous Knowledge. We also had students on a panel discussion, two of whom promoted their up-and-coming podcast called "Read the Climate."

Following the Climate & Justice Teach-In, Service Learning and Civic Engagement hosted a Civic Action Party dedicated to Earth Month and Associated Students, Inc. had an Innovation and Sustainability Panel, both just as interactive and informative as they were fun. There was also an exceptional turnout for The Journey to Zero Waste Fair, a great addition to our Earth Month activities. Roughly 600 campus community members passed through while we gave out free office supplies, utensils, produce bags, clothes, and other items. Kona Ice was provided while the Staff Center participated with a food drive.

Composting, Coming Soon!

Keep an eye out for new waste bins on campus! We are getting 42 new sets of Bigbelly waste bins, each including landfill, recycle and compost. With the state-wide effort of SB-1383, California's Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Strategy, we are required to provide composting bins across campus. This change also includes a change in signage. You will notice each bin will have clear waste signage of what can and cannot go into the bin. Not only is this a part of a state-wide effort, it is also integral in getting us to our goal of Zero Waste by 2025. We hope to divert 90-95% of our waste from going to the landfill, and with your help - we will get there!

Zero Waste by 2025

As part of our Zero Waste efforts, we have also implemented a new form for diverting office supplies from going straight to the landfill. If you or someone in your office is cleaning out their space, getting rid of binders, office organizers, and any other desk-side office supplies you can use this form. One of our sustainability team members will pick up your items and we will make sure it gets reused on campus, donated to Goodwill or properly recycled. Safety, Health, and Sustainability (SH&S)

SH&S has successfully implemented a new chemical inventory process that uses RFID (Radio Frequency Identification). CSUSM is the first CSU to use this new technology. The project was led by **Everett Kekoa** with lots of help from **Vanessa Rivera**, **Victor Franco**, and our student technician **Ivanel De-Jesus-Alicea**. By utilizing RFID technology, SH&S staff will no longer have to physically pick up every bottle in order to scan it. Not only does this make the annual inventory reconciliation safer, but it also makes it exponentially faster which in turn protects the integrity of certain chemical products which must be kept under cold storage or protected from moisture in the air. Furthermore, the integration of RFID tags with the Risk & Safety Solutions app allows lab personnel to search, add, and remove chemicals from mobile devices such as a smartphone or tablet, making this new inventory system highly convenient as well.





Over the last two years, the University purchased hand sanitizer to keep our students, faculty and staff protected during the COVID-19 pandemic. We recently noticed that a shipment of over 5,000 bottles had expired and distributed. could longer be Robyn Araiza Chemistry/Biochemistry), Victor Franco Bolanos (CSTEM Equipment Technician), and Dr. Kang Do (CSTEM) volunteered to test the hand sanitizer using an FT-IR (Fourier Transform Infrared Spectroscopy). Next, they ran those samples through the NMR (Nuclear Magnetic Resonance) to verify the amount of alcohol in the hand sanitizer. By doing this difficult testing, the team determined that the hand sanitizer still had the appropriate amount of alcohol (greater than 60%) to be effective. This saved the University thousands of dollars by avoiding hazardous waste disposal costs.

Science Hall 2 - Exhaust Project

FDM is wrapping up the Science Hall 2 – 308 Exhaust Project. The scope of the project includes replacing exhaust fan 37-6 with an upsized unit, supply additional general exhaust, tying into the existing strobic exhaust fans, and providing exhaust to Science Hall 2 Lab Room 308.

Energy Management & Utility Services

Energy Management and Utility Services has been keeping busy with many projects across campus. Some project highlights include:

- HVAC renovations and upgrades in areas of Commons and Science Hall 2
- State elevator inspections and testing of our 45 elevators and 5 wheelchair lifts
- Developing a project to replace the Clarke Field House's chiller
- Overhauling the treated water program on campus which provides the heating and cooling on campus
- Gearing up to replace our Building Automation System. This system centrally controls the HVAC and lighting across campus
- · Preparing to bring solar generation to campus
- Completed a project to add 42 airflow monitoring stations across various HVAC units
- Epoxy coated the water-boxes of the Central Plant Chillers (before and after pictures below):







Rene Carrillo obtained his Building Operator Certificate I credential. This is a nationally recognized professional certification that provides building operators with the knowledge and skills associated with scoping energy efficiency improvements and enhancing building operations.

We also continue to maintain our HVAC systems at a very high level and frequently monitor regulatory guidelines.

- All of our buildings have air change rates that are considered either Excellent or Ideal
- We have maximized the outside air drawn into the buildings while also minimizing/eliminating the use of recirculated air where possible
- The vast majority of our campus has MERV 13 or MERV 14 filtration which meets or exceeds the pandemic target filtration efficiency
- We have increased the number of hours that our HVAC systems run so that the buildings are flushed before and after occupancy
- Filters are checked on a weekly basis by journey-level technicians (among the many other preventive maintenance activities)




Facility Services






Electrical Shop - The electrical shop has been

Business & Financial Services

The Fiscal Services department has performed another successful fiscal legal close for 2021/2022! So what is fiscal close? It is a 250+ task project that typically starts in March and is due by July 15th. The purpose of this project is to ensure that financial transactions for the fiscal year (payments, accruals, journal entries, obligations, etc.) are properly recorded and reported to the Chancellor's Office. For context, activities at our campus produce more than 150,000 accounting lines! A summary of all these transactions is eventually consolidated and reported to the State Controller's Office. CSUSM had a clean submission (no errors!) which means our fiscal close was of the highest quality and completed in a timely manner a few days before the deadline.

Fiscal close involves collaboration across the entire campus. Representatives from the following departments come together to make this happen and team up through recurring meetings:
