Statewide Assessments: Just One Measure of Bella's Progress

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) results in English Language Arts/Literacy (ELA) and mathematics give one measure of how well students are mastering California's challenging academic standards. The skills called for by these standards—the ability to write clearly, think critically, and solve problems—are essential for preparing students for college and a 21st-century career.

- **Standard Not Met** (Level 1)

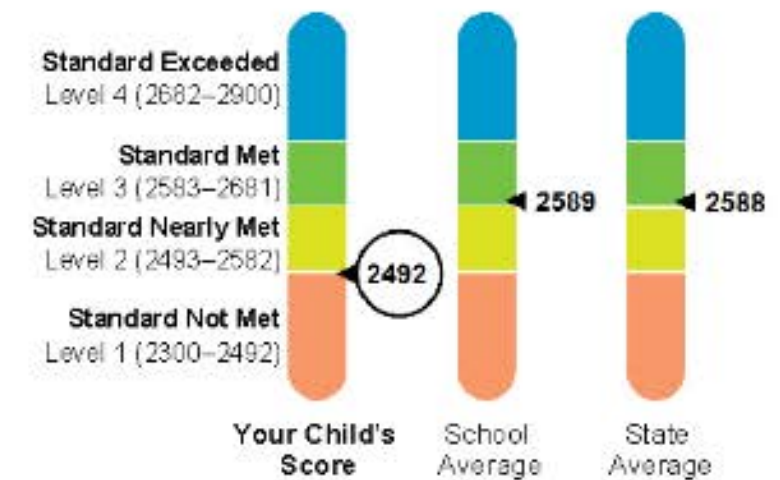
College Readiness

Area Performance cannot be reported this year because the test given in 2020–21 was shorter than the test given last year.

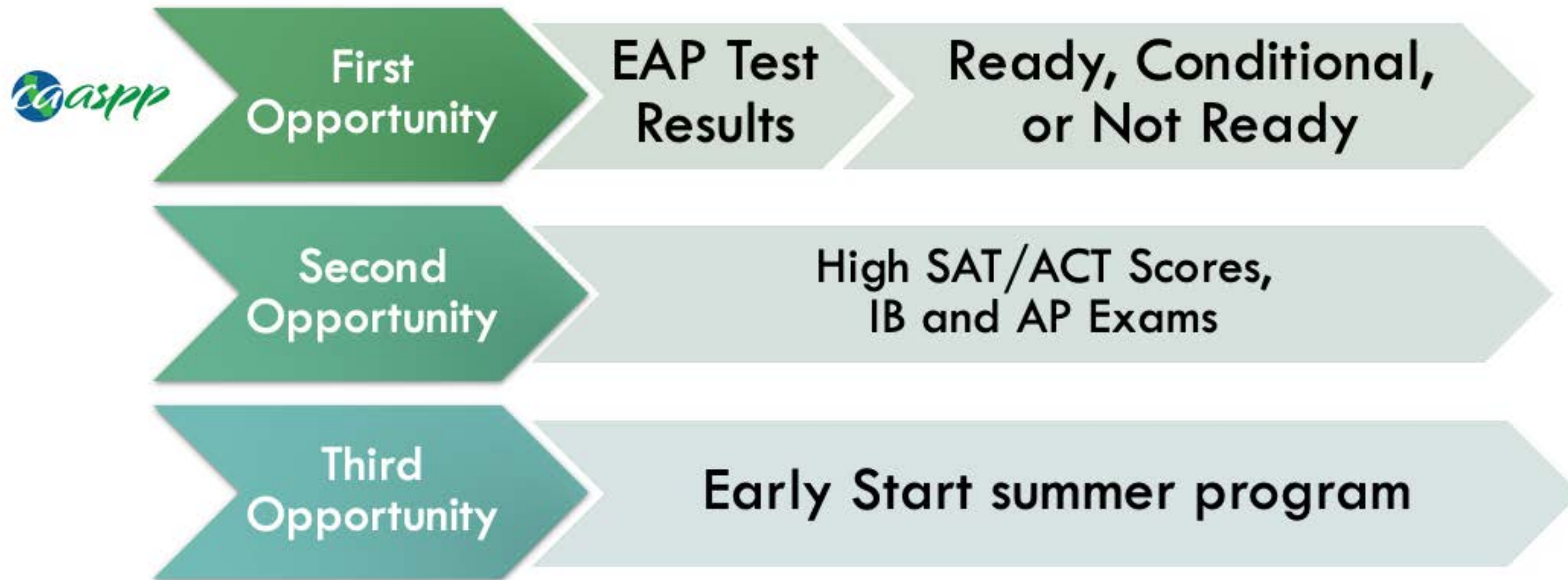


Academic Preparation

COURSE PLACEMENT

Fulfilled-Category 1

Student has met the CSU GE Breadth Subarea A2 and/or B4 requirement via Advanced Placement (AP) examination, International Baccalaureate (IB) examination or transferable course.

Ready-Category 2

Student has met examination standards and/or multiple measures-informed standards.

Ready with support and optional participation in Early Start-Category 3

Based on new multiple measures, student needs additional academic support. Participation in the Early Start Program is recommended and may be highly advisable for some students, particularly STEM majors .

Ready with support and required participation in Early Start-Category 4

Based on new multiple measures, student needs additional academic support. Participation in the Early Start Program is required.

If you did not meet any of the criteria in the first three columns, you will be required to participate in the Early Start Program (ESP) and placed in a supported GE B4 math/QR course.

Students only need to check one of these boxes. SAT/ACT scores will be used for placement and not admissions.

Early Start is no longer required for incoming freshmen. It is still recommended for students in Category 3 and Category 4. Every CSU campus has their own Early Start program.



A tuition waiver pool will be available to provide financial support for students attending the summer phases before and/or at the end first academic year of their first matriculated term for Supportive Pathways for First-Year Students instruction.
