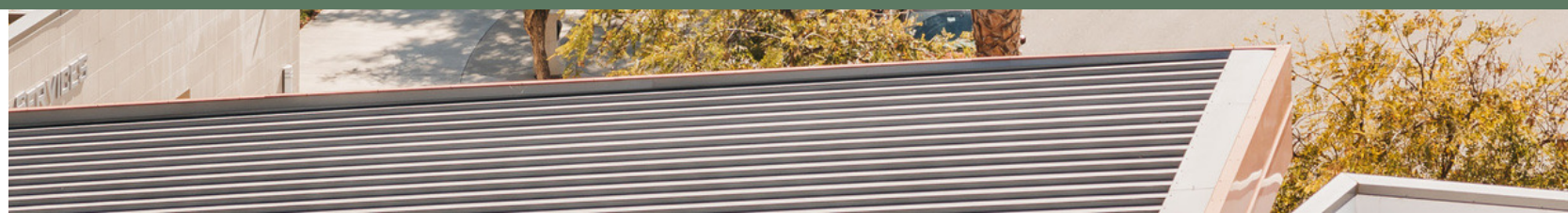

- CSU System-Wide Single-Use Plastics Policy



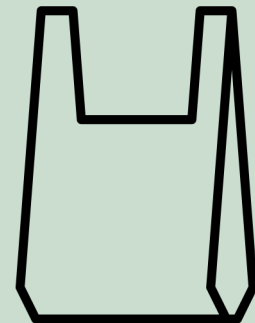
CSU System Wide Single Use Plastics Policy

Must be compostable or paper- for on campus distribution

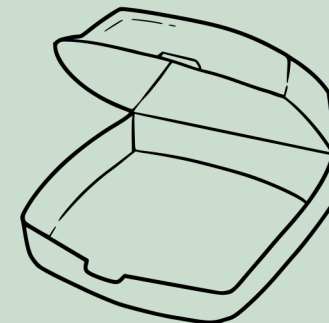
2019

- ✓ Styrofoam

- ✗ Food scraps
- ✗ Paper or cardboard
- ✗ Cans
- ✗ Glass
- ✗ Plastics #1 - #7




 **RECYCLING**
Keep trash and compost out!

Yes

- ✓ Glass
- ✓ Aluminum (cans & foil)
- ✓ Plastic #1 - #7 (cups & lids)
- ✓ Paper & cardboard (coffee cups)

No

- ✗ Food scraps
- ✗ Liquids
- ✗ Soft plastic
- ✗ Food-soiled paper products (napkins & cups)



 **COMPOST**
If it grows, it goes!

Yes

- ✓ Cooked/uncooked food
- ✓ Coffee grounds/filters
- ✓ Fruits & vegetables
- ✓ Meat & bones
- ✓ Food-soiled paper products (pizza boxes, napkins, & cups)

No

- ✗ Masks
- ✗ Glass
- ✗ Cans
- ✗ Plastics
