Hiram Lopez an SSS student, was selected to participate in the Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute (CHCI) Summer Internship.

The Congressional Hispanic Caucus Institute (CHCI) is a non-profit, non-partisan educational organization dedicated to developing the next generation of Latino leaders. CHCI's educational services are designed to provide Latino students with the tools and resources they need to succeed in attaining a higher education.

The Summer Internship takes place every summer (early June-early August), in Washington D.C., for 32 promising Latino undergraduates from across the country that are selected for an eight-week program in the nation's capital. While in DC, interns work in the offices of U.S. representatives. Interns benefit from the leadership development curriculum's emphasis on work experience, community service, and learning. This comprehensive three-prong approach fosters critical professional development and personal growth in the participants. Hiram was placed to work with Congresswoman Loretta Sanchez (CA-47).

Hiram states:

Through CHCI internship I have:

- ◆ A better understanding of public policy issues and the legislative process.
- ◆ Had the opportunity to meet national leaders who play an essential role in the legislative process so that I can take their advice and use it to achieve my future career goals in the political spectrum.

What I want to do or be doing in five years ?

I see myself graduating from law school becoming a successful Latino lawyer that will endlessly advocate for social justice.



## AMENDED LAPTOP CHECK-OUT PROCEDURES

- ♦ Laptops are issued on a first come, first serve basis
- ♦ Laptops are only checked-out on Mondays after 1:00 PM and must be returned the following Monday, before 12 Noon.
- ♦ If the laptop is not returned within the above stated time limits, you will lose your check-out privileges for that semester.
- ♦ **IMPORTANT:** You are responsible for the costs of replacing a laptop you have checked-out, if it is lost, damaged or stolen.



## TRiO STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM REQUIREMENT UPDATES

### Mandatory for First Year incoming Freshmen:

Adhere to the course selections provided by the TRiO SSS counselors and advisors for my first two semesters at CSUSM;

- ◊ Attend required Supplemental Instruction sessions if offered during my first year.
- ◊ Satisfy the ELM/EPT requirement within the first year
- ◊ Satisfy the Computer Competency Requirement within the first year
- ◊ Participate in SSS/EOP forums/workshops, campus activities, and cultural events.
- ◊ Understand that any stipend provided will be determined by Federal guidelines and CSUSM TRiO SSS stipulations

### Transfer and continuing SSS students requirements:

Complete **at least two** contacts per semester with TRiO SSS. Of the two mandatory contacts, **one contact** must be with a TRiO SSS professional staff member and the other contact must be completed by participating in TRiO SSS sponsored services. Services include SSS workshops, cultural events and similar activities. Check with TRiO SSS staff FIRST if you are not sure about the event, Activity or service.

#### Please Note:

Your first TRiO SSS contact must take place within the first 6 weeks of school each semester
